So the little boy went outside and there he met a little girl. He asked, “**Do you know where there is a little red house with no doors and no windows and a star inside?**”

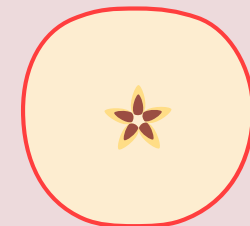
